DCIL aims to provide independent, integrated living opportunities to disabled people through a range of services. This support is based on the seven needs identified by disabled people: Information, Counselling, Housing, Technical Aids, Personal Assistance, Transport and Access.

These services include an Information Service, Peer Counselling Service, Independent Living Support and Community Development.

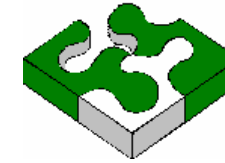

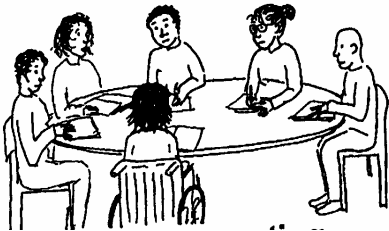


Disabled People's Volunteering and Training Opportunities

Why get involved?

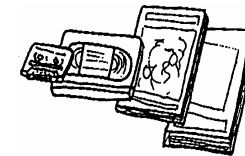
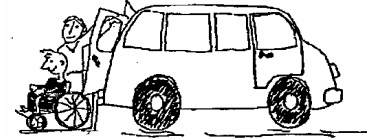
There are many different reasons why people get in touch with us, you might want to:
